Roach Rid Gel Instructions



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Instructions

Application Notes

Remove the cap, touch nozzle tip to surface and apply.

Bait will stick to non-greasy or non-dusty surfaces and will remain palatable as long as it is visible.

Recap nozzle after use. Reapply when bait is no longer visible. Check baits a week after initial application.

Numerous smaller applications are better than a small number of larger spots. It may take up to one month to get control of the situation. Reapply gel as necessary.

The bait will be most effective in a clean area where there are no other food sources for the cockroaches.

Precautions

Do not:

Use near open food and food contact surfaces.

Use this product on or around electrical equipment due to the possibility of electric shock.

Apply gel to areas which have been recently sprayed with insecticides, or spray insecticides over gel.

Apply to surfaces where the temperature exceeds 54° C.

Place baits where washing operations may transfer diluted bait to food or food Preparation surfaces.

Place product in locations that are accessible to children.

Place product in areas that are accessible to domestic animals, livestock or birds.

Contaminate streams, rivers or waterways with the chemical or used containers.

Safety Considerations

Harmful if swallowed. When using the product wear rubber gloves. Wash hands after use.

Cockroaches

Cockroaches can be controlled using insecticide sprays which rely on contact, baits which kill by consumption, and glue traps which stick them to a surface. Cockroaches tend to be found where water, food, and harborage are most accessible.

They are crack and crevice dwellers and therefore insecticides and baits need to be placed as near as possible to those areas where they are living.

Baits are extremely effective as cockroaches eat each others faeces and are cannibalistic. One cockroach that has eaten cockroach gel bait can in effect cause 44 other cockroaches to die.

There is a domino effect that results by consuming each others faeces and bodies. When controlling cockroaches remember they tend to concentrate in those areas where they can access food, water, and harborage areas.

In residential structures, kitchens and bathrooms generally develop the highest infestations. Moisture is essential for cockroach survival and is sought more frequently than food.
